- The Office on Violence Against Women is committed to supporting approaches around the world that bring together public-private partnerships in holding offenders accountable and keeping victims safe.






Statement from the Honorable Katharine Sullivan, Principal Deputy Director, Office on Violence Against Women, US DOJ

Findings: California Evaluation 2013




- Up to 50% of survivors receive between 3-5 types of services.
- Counseling (38-55%) and civil-legal (36-45%) services are the most requested.
- 68% cases filed (misdemeanor or felony) resulted in conviction (above natl/state averages).


