
Multi agency approach of violence against women has shown encouraging results, but there are still major obstacleS:

1. Victims are still expected to travel to a variety of organisations to get safety, help and support


2. Victims have to tell their story over and over again








The Municiplity of Hässleholm's chart for government contacts women may need when they become victims of domestic violence

WHAT IS A FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER?

ONE-STOP-SHOP for victims of domestic and sexual violence and their children

All services survivors need are under one roof





GUIDING PRINCIPLES (1)



Increase safety, promote healing, and foster empowerment through services for victims and their children



Provide victim-centered services that promote victim autonomy





GUIDING PRINCIPLES (2)

Survivor-driven

Shape services to clients by asking them what they need

Empowered

Offer survivors a place to belong even after crisis intervention services are no longer necessary





GUIDING PRINCIPLES (3)

Relationship-based

Maintain close working relationships among all collaborators/agencies

Offender-accountability

Increase offender accountability through evidence-based prosecution strategies and/or evidence based treatment programs.





EU Project Objectives

- To develop a coherent approach of family violence against women, which effectively help to stop the violence
- Creating a network of Family Justice Centers in Europe, working with the co-located formula on a client centered base, meeting the needs of the victims of violence and their children AND holding perpetrators accountable.

Pilot FJC Antwerp - 1

- multidisciplinary approach of family violence
- client in the centre of the approach, working on involvement of family members
- involvement of police, justice, social welfare, social care, youth care, centre child abuse, women's help, perpetrator program, housing, mental health,...
- method of chain approach towards the "hard" cases of family violence (need both justice and social approach, safety of victims/children endangered, multiple problems in the family,...)





Pilot FJC Antwerp - 2

- all key-partners under one roof, experts working together, sharing information, matching actions with partners and family members
- wrap-around-model trying to reach out to all members of the family (victims, children perpetrator, involved other members of the system,...)
- focus on the aggression, the underlying problems (all family members) and the strengths in the family
- families enter after referral by professional (wide range: police, justice, welfare, youth care, women's help,...)






Target group FJC Antwerp

- Complex situation that demands a multi-agency approach
