

'The Istanbul Convention'





#### Article 7 – Comprehensive and co-ordinated policies

Parties shall take the necessary legislative and other measures to adopt and implement State-wide effective, comprehensive and co-ordinated policies encompassing all relevant measures to prevent and combat all forms of violence covered by the scope of this Convention and offer a holistic response to violence against women.





Parties shall take the necessary legislative or other measures, in accordance with internal law, to ensure that there are appropriate mechanisms to provide for effective cooperation between all relevant state agencies, including the judiciary, public prosecutors, law enforcement agencies, local and regional authorities as well as non-governmental organisations and other relevant organisations and entities, in protecting and supporting victims and witnesses of all forms of violence covered by the scope of this Convention.





#### Parties shall ensure that measures taken pursuant to this chapter shall:

- be based on a gendered understanding of violence against women and domestic violence and shall focus on the human rights and safety of the victim;
- ▶ be based on an integrated approach which takes into account the relationship between victims, perpetrators, children and their wider social environment;
- aim at avoiding secondary victimisation;
- aim at the empowerment and economic independence of women victims of violence;
- > allow, where appropriate, for a range of protection and support services to be located on the same premises;
- > address the specific needs of vulnerable persons, including child victims, and be made available to them.



## The development of the multidisciplinary approach in Europe, what do we have to challenge?

- Not all countries are focusing on positive change on gender based violence. There's a strong (religious) movement that embraces the old (family) traditions and is not willing to change these. They are challenging the directives of the Istanbul Convention.
- The influx of more than a million migrants and refugees from active warzones into Europe. They bring their own values and views on violence against women and children, based on their own habits and way of life in their home countries.
